

















Lesbian




Gay Man




Bisexual

Bisexual






Trans

Trans






Questioning




Pangender




Pansexual




Asexual




Agender




Genderfluid





The reality of discrimination in sport

Stonewall LGBT Britain 2018

- One in ten LGBT people (10 per cent) who attended a live sporting event in the last year experienced discrimination because of their sexual orientation and/or gender identity.
- More than two in five LGBT people (43 per cent) think public sporting events aren't a welcoming space for LGBT people
- One in eight LGBT people (12 per cent) avoid going to the gym or participating in sports groups because of fear of discrimination and harassment.
- Two in five trans people (38 per cent) avoid going to the gym or participating in sports groups because of fear of discrimination and harassment.

What is a gender-affected sport?

A gender-affected activity is a sport, game or other activity of a competitive nature in circumstances in which the physical strength, stamina or physique of average persons of one sex would put them at a disadvantage compared with average persons of the other sex as competitors in events involving the activity.
